

# **\_include\_wsc\_proofreader\_cloud\_initialization\_autosearch \_inline\_data\_attributes**

In general, the initialization of WProofreader using inline attributes is a good option if you want to have a single script with the base options. In order to define an additional option as an inline data attribute, use '**data-wsc-option\_name**', e.g. 'data-wsc-lang'.

There is a limitation which must be taken into account when using inline data attributes for the WProofreader options. As for now, only options which have **boolean** or **string** types can be used as data attributes. The options with **array** or **number** type **are not supported** (e.g. **actionItems**, **suggestionsCount**, **moreSuggestionsCount**).
